Formal Public Consultation

Under the terms of the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations (2012), the submitted Neighbourhood Development Plan for Peasmarsh Neighbourhood Area has now been published by Rother District Council for Public Consultation.

The consultation period runs until 4:30pm on Friday March 31st 2023.

Neighbourhood Development Plan Regulation 14 Comments

Stakeholders

Just over 60 stakeholders responded to the Consultation. Nearly 50 of those were objecting to either the Cornerways site or the Flackley Ash site, both allocated in the Plan.

One of the responders was Ethical Partnership on behalf of Peasmarsh Place, essentially with respect to the suggested major development on the Tanyard Field site which was not allocated, in fact was ruled out as a development site back in August 2022. It reads in places like a prospectus for the outline concept some of us were able to inspect last Fastertide

Statutory Consultees

Seven of the 28 total number of statutory consultees responded, one of which was a 'no comment' response. Significant responses were received from RDC, ESCC, Historic England and Southern Water.

Most of Rother's comments were helpful with the clear intent of improving the Plan.

The ESCC comments were mainly about changing the emphasis of the Plan to strengthen sustainability, health and wellbeing.

Historic England, again as might be expected, were about heritage assets but more as generalisations than particular comments.

The SW responses were all about casting the company in a good light and trying to show that there are no issues with the Peasmarsh sewage system. It helped strengthen the Plan but not as SW would like.

Neighbourhood Development Plan Submitted Plan

The Parish Council approved the revised Plan on February 9th and it was submitted to Rother a few days later. This note outlines the main changes made as a result of the Regulation 14 Public Consultation and the PNDP internal review.

Structure

The main changes to the structure were to move the subsection and policy on public transport from '4: Infrastructure' to '3: Landscape, the Environment and Heritage' and to include all maps in the body of the Plan with links to larger and more legible versions online.

Policies

In addition to the move above, policy L1 is deleted as too general and already covered by RDC policies and policy I1 is deleted as not not suitable for an NDP so it has moved to '10: Aspirations'.

Most of the policies have changed in the detailed wording, in general to strengthen them.

Plan Content

Some of the wording has been changed, sometimes supported by pictures, in response to the comments received from the consultation. This is mainly to help explain the thinking behind the sometimes insufficiently lucid wording of the draft Plan. In addition a few extra maps are included for the same reason.

Appendices

The appendix of maps, as described above, is deleted but a new appendix is added to explain the thinking behind the locally significant views and green spaces.

Statements

As required by the regulations, there are two additional documents : the Basic Conditions Statement and the Consultation Statement.
