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The second [Regulation 16] public consultation on the Peasmarsh Neighbourhood Development Plan concluded at the end of March.

The consultation was conducted by Rother District Council so the burden of collating the responses falls on it, not the PNDP group. These should be available by the time of the next Periodical as that is when the Examiner is due to start his work.

To repeat last month's key point : **our electoral system is important for good democracy**, refreshing the various levels of councils that govern us. The election for Rother councillors is on May 4th, the Thursday before the Coronation To reduce election fraud we will have to have an **accepted photo ID** in order to vote in person. More information is available on page 2.

Page 3 has an article explaining why there will not be an election for our Parish Councillors. More importantly, it **seeks volunteers to be co-opted onto the Council** in order to bring its numbers up closer to the legal maximum and reduce the risk of Rother having to take direct control of our parish affairs.

As a result of the changes to the Parish Council, there will be two council meetings in May – see page 5 for more information.

Finally, an early warning : the Annual Assembly of the Parish will be on Wednesday May 31st in the Memorial Hall at 7:30pm.

Local Elections

The local elections for Rother District Councillors will be taking place on **Thursday May 4**th in the Memorial Hall. There is no election for our Parish Council.

We will need to present an **accepted form of photo ID** in order to vote such as one of the following :

Passport,

Driving licence / Blue badge,

certain Travel Cards [e.g. older person's bus pass],

Identity card with PASS mark

Defence identity card.

If you don't have a suitable form of ID and intend to vote in person then you can apply for a **Voter Authority Certificate** but be quick : you must apply by **Tuesday April 25**th. The application is undertaken online :

Uncontested Parish Council Election

Why is the election uncontested? Our Parish Council is allowed to have a maximum of nine councillors so a contested election is required when more than that number of people are seeking election to the council.

Well, the sad truth of the matter is that it is uncontested because, other than five of the existing councillors – Robert Barham, Ray Hollman, Peter Lamont, David Pankhurst and Gina Sanderson, no other resident wished to stand for election.

The council is now reduced to only five councillors as three of the existing councillors – Ben Clinton, Mick Coleman and Hilary Pankhurst – decided not to stand. All eight deserve our thanks for the amount of work put in over the last four years.

Having only five councillors leaves the parish council in a precarious position as it may not be able to undertake many of its functions and statutory duties if insufficient councillors are able to attend a council meeting. **Our parish business could ultimately end up being administered by Rother District Council**.

However the council has the ability to co-opt [but not conscript!] members so volunteers are still needed to fill the four vacancies. The more councillors there are, the better the council will be able to function.

There is no point complaining about what the council does if you don't argue your point from inside. This is your chance to do so.
