# Neighbourhood Plan Examination

The Examiner has decided that he should hold a public hearing as part of his examination of the parish Neighbourhood Development Plan.

The public hearing will take place on **Thursday 21st September 2023** in the Memorial Hall, starting at 10:00. Note, however, that the Examiner is very clear that, although it is a public hearing, only specific parties can participate. It is therefore a formal hearing conducted by the Examiner at which the public is free to observe.

To repeat from last month, the key questions that are to be addressed are, in precis, as follows :

- what is the amount of housing development that is appropriate for the village up to 2039, particularly given the size of the Pippins site, and is the parish location within an AONB a limiting factor?
- is the extent and capacity of the existing drainage infrastructure a constraint on how much development can be accommodated in the parish and what infrastructure improvements should developers be expected to provide?
- will sustainable drainage solutions be capable of overcoming surface water flooding issues or should sites which are known to flood be compared with other sites with less flooding risk?
- where should the new homes be allocated relative to local services and should sites away from the development boundary be allocated, especially if the sites are for purely affordable housing?

As mentioned before, the Examiner will be in the parish the day before the hearing, visiting some of the sites considered during the preparation of the Plan. He has made it clear that the visits are to familiarise himself with the sites and that **no representations will be taken**. Please do not try and approach the Examiner, should you see him, other than a polite greeting.
